Unit Mission: The mission of Union Bible College Ministry Program is to prepare students for ministry within the local church and to change the world with the Unchanging Word.

Unit Purpose: The purpose of Union Bible College Ministry Program is to equip servant-leaders entering ministry to combine knowledge from several traditional fields. The student will take general education classes, Bible and theology, and will focus on a particular area of ministry. In the BA in Vocational Ministry program the student may transfer into the college forty hours of a vocational or technical training from another college. The AA in Christian Studies gives a foundation of general studies, Bible and theology, and allows the student to select a ministry area offered by the college.
