

UBCA Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds Reporting

In compliance with the Department of Education, Union Bible College has signed and returned to the DOE the Certification and Agreement and assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004 (a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Union Bible College received \$17,172 from the Department of Education pursuant to our Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

All \$17,172 has been distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of August 5, 2020.

UBC has 40 students who are eligible to participate in federal student financial aid programs under Section 484 of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, and thus are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

Union Bible College disbursed Emergency Financial Aid grants to 40 students.

All full-time students that are eligible to participate in federal student financial aid programs under Section 484 of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, received an equal distribution of funds. Part-time students (minimum of 6 credit hours) that are eligible to participate in the above-mentioned programs received 50% of that same allotment. These are the methods UBC used to determine how much each student would receive.

Union Bible College notified students of the Emergency Financial Aid grants and provided guidance through a letter.
